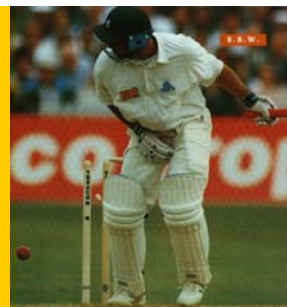

However the unorthodox approach of T Lee (23) picked up valuable runs as the total began to build. J Chidwick (35) contributed a valuable innings despite the efforts of A Burgess (4-2-8-0) and I Vazquez (9-2-16-1). Setting a total of 146 Martlets felt confident of getting something out of the match.

Polegate elected to bat in cold conditions and a slow looking wicket. Opener B Maynard (20) remained positive despite the early loss of K Depper and looked to score of each loose ball eventually falling to a sharp catch at point from T Hawkins. P Hart (37) combined well with A Williams (33) and punished any short balls, despatching them to all boundaries. Martlets T Norman took up the challenge and single handily changed the tide. Polegate appeared to underestimate his bowling and wickets tumbled as he found a good line and length. Taking career best figures of 6-44 Norman pulled Martlets back into the game. Setting a total of 163 Polegate & Stone Cross remained confident.

In reply Martlets took up the challenge from the off with M Long (26) carrying on from recent

weeks exploits. His aggressive batting against most deliveries kept Martlets well up in the run chase. As he fell to a miss-timed shot Polegate must have remained confident. T Hawkins (35) had no intention of letting up and continued where Long left off with some lusty blows and well executed drives. Laws of the Game

Following recent controversies and strange decisions I thought it'd be a good idea to highlight some of the laws of our beloved game – especially following recent changes.

Fortunately we have a resident league umpire in our midst who I'm sure will be pleased to discuss the issues – for the price of a beer or two of course.

So.. When your next umpiring (as we all so willingly do!) You'll know what to do!

Run Outs

LAW 38 RUN OUT

1. Out Run out

(a) Either batsman is out Run out, except as in 2 below, if at any time while the ball is in play

(i) he is out of his ground and (ii) his wicket is fairly put down by the opposing side.

(b) (a) above shall apply even though No ball has been called and whether or not a run is being attempted, except in the circumstances of Law 39.3(b) (Not out Stumped).

2. Batsman not Run out

Notwithstanding 1 above, a batsman is not out Run out if

(a) he has been within his ground and has subsequently left it to avoid injury, when the wicket is put down.

(b) the ball has not subsequently been touched again by a fielder, after the bowler

has entered his delivery stride, before the wicket is put down.

(c) the ball, having been played by the striker, or having come off his person, directly strikes a helmet worn by a

fielder and without further contact with him or any other fielder rebounds directly on to the wicket. However, the ball remains in play and either batsman may be Run out in the circumstances of 1 above if a

wicket is subsequently put down.

(d) he is out Stumped. See Law 39.1(b) (Out Stumped).

(e) he is out of his ground, not attempting a run and his wicket is fairly put down

by the wicket-keeper without the intervention of another member of the fielding

side, if No ball has been called. See Law 39.3(b) (Not out Stumped).

3. Which batsman is out

The batsman out in the circumstances of 1 above is the one whose ground is at the

end where the wicket is put down. See Laws 2.8 (Transgression of the Laws by a

LBW

LAW 36 LEG BEFORE WICKET

1. Out LBW

The striker is out LBW in the circumstances set out below.

(a) The bowler delivers a ball, not being a No ball and (b) the ball, if it is not inter-



cepted full pitch, pitches in line between

wicket and wicket or on the off side of the striker's wicket

and (c) the ball not having previously touched his bat, the striker intercepts

the ball, either full-pitch or after pitching, with any part of his person

and (d) the point of impact, even if above the level of the bails, either (i) is between wicket and wicket

or (ii) is either between wicket and wicket or outside the line of the off stump, if the striker has made no genuine attempt to play the ball with his bat

~~and (e) but for the interception, the ball would have hit the wicket.~~

2. Interception of the ball

(a) In assessing points (c), (d) and (e) in 1 above, only the first interception is to

be considered.

(b) In assessing point (e) in 1 above, it is to be assumed that the path of the ball

before interception would have continued after interception, irrespective of

whether the ball might have pitched subsequently or not.

3. Off side of wicket

The off side of the striker's wicket shall be determined by the striker's stance at

~~the moment the ball comes into play for that delivery.~~
